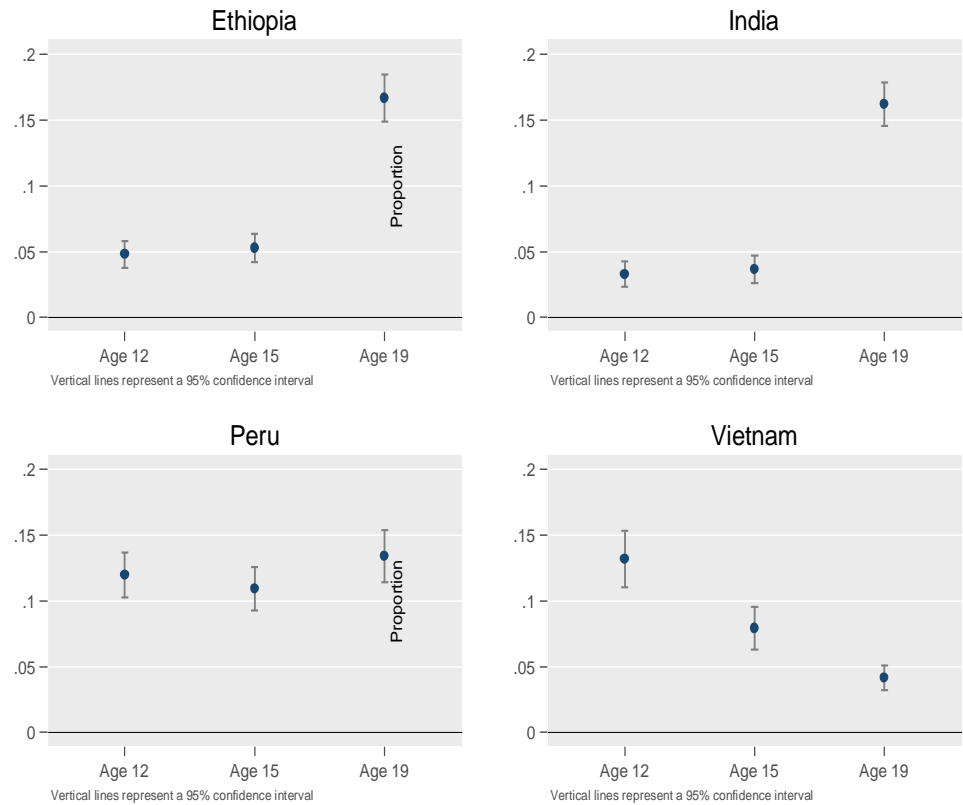


Chart: Proportion running out of food

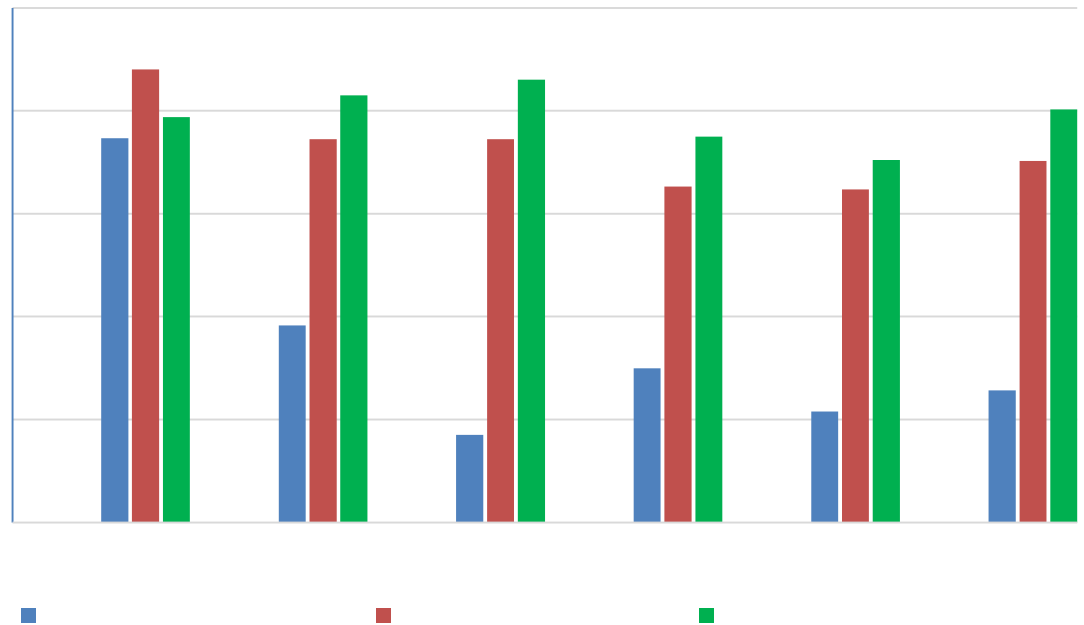
Continuing studies during school closures has been almost impossible for students without access to both internet and a device to learn on.
